Investment Manager

The Wholesale Multi-Strategy Fund invests into the JP Morgan Alternative Asset Management Hedge Fund Solutions JP Morgan Multi Manager Alternatives Fund (MMAF).

JPMAAM HFS is led by CIO Paul Zummo who cofounded the business in 1994 and is still head of the Portfolio Management Group and chairs the JPMAAM HSF Investment Committee. Paul has over 25 years industry experience and is a member of the CFA Institute.

Overview

The fund provides access to a multi-manager, multistrategy investment fund designed to generate returns over the long term.

The portfolio has a diversified risk profile with low to medium volatility.

Objective

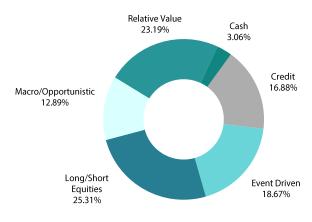
The fund aims to outperform the benchmark return before fees, expenses and taxes over a rolling threeyear period.

Market Commentary

June continued to be positive for both equities and fixed income. Continued momentum in mega-cap tech names lifted risk assets higher in June. Softer economic and inflation data in the US slightly nudged yields lower despite the hawkish tone at the Federal Reserve's June conference. Both stock and bond markets saw positive gains, with the MSCI World Index returning +2.07% and the Barclays Global Aggregate Bond Index returning +0.14% over the month.

Two out of five strategy returns were positive for the month of June.

Relative Value Strategy (Return: +1.81%)

Relative Value strategies had a strong month, with most gains coming from quantitative equity manager. Additional gains were made in the multi-strategy portfolio, particularly from index option trading. In our efforts to increase uncorrelated exposure, our recent addition, a statistical arbitrage manager also contributed modest gains for the month.

Credit Strategy (Return: +0.82%)

Credit strategies delivered positive returns for the month. The municipal bond trading sub-strategy continue to deliver strong gains with additional gains coming from the structured credit sub-strategy.

Macro/Opportunistic Strategy (Return: -0.83%)

Macro strategies detracted modestly overall in June. The CTA sub-strategy detracted with most losses coming from short bond futures positioning while the quantitative macro sub-strategy detracted driven by long index futures and long metals positioning which were partially offset by gains in FX trades and short agricultural commodities.

Event Driven Strategy (Return: -0.91%)

Multi-event portfolios delivered losses driven by broad equity names such as (Charter Communications, Solventum Corp) which were partially offset by modest gains in convertible bond trades. Losses were also contributed by the shareholder engagement strategy coming mainly from CCTs like sustainable biorefinery platform Green Plains and US railroad company Norfolk Southern. The investment thesis for both trades remains consistent as shareholder engagement efforts continue, including advocating for a full sale of Green Plains and continued efforts to remove the Norfolk Southern CEO and strengthen its operations, utilizing the three new board seats the manager won. An omni channel marketplace auction company RB Global was positive for the month which helped offset some of the losses.

Long/Short Equity Strategy (Return: -1.15%)

Most of the losses were driven by a value-oriented US long/short manager with exposure in materials and information technology (Constellium SE, Flex Ltd.) followed by a fundamental long/short manager with exposure to industrials (Vertiv Holdings, Array Technologies Inc). A China focused manager also lost money via healthcare exposure in China. These losses were partially offset by a technology sector specialist, driven by long positions within semiconductors (Nvidia, Tower Semiconductor) followed by positions in consumer discretionary and communication services.
