## **Investment Manager**

The Wholesale Multi-Strategy Fund invests into the JP Morgan Alternative Asset Management Hedge Fund Solutions JP Morgan Multi Manager Alternatives Fund (MMAF).

JPMAAM HFS is led by CIO Paul Zummo who cofounded the business in 1994 and is still head of the Portfolio Management Group and chairs the JPMAAM HSF Investment Committee. Paul has over 25 years industry experience and is a member of the CFA Institute.

#### Overview

The fund provides access to a multi-manager, multistrategy investment fund designed to generate returns over the long term.

The portfolio has a diversified risk profile with low to medium volatility.

#### Objective

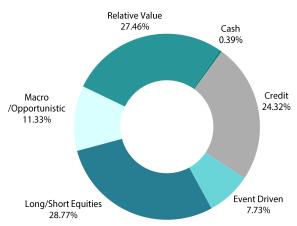
The fund aims to outperform the benchmark return before fees, expenses and taxes over a rolling threeyear period.

#### **Market Commentary**

The beginning of 2025 saw positive returns in both equities and bonds. US equities benefited from President Trump's return to the White House and his 'America First' policy agenda. However, the rise of Chinese AI company DeepSeek raised concerns about the US technology sector's ability to meet high expectations. Bond markets experienced increased volatility in January. President Trump's proposed policy mix of tax cuts, immigration curbs and tariffs fuelled expectations for higher US inflation, pushed yields up globally. As such, the **MSCI World Index** returned +3.55% and the **Barclays Global Aggregate Bond Index** returned +0.57% over the month.

#### Fund Commentary (source: JPMAAM for underlying USD share class)

Four out of five strategy returns were positive for the month of January.

#### Relative Value Strategy (Return: +3.62%)

The relative value strategy was the top performing strategy for the month, providing a strong start to the year. Gains were contributed by statistical arbitrage managers driven by positions within healthcare, industrials and financials sectors. Significant gains also came from the multi-strategy portfolio, driven by index trading and positions in information technology sector.

#### Long/Short Equity Strategy (Return: +3.36%)

The long/short equity strategy ended the month on a strong note, with all the managers contributing to the gains. Most of the gains were contributed by a consumer-focused manager driven by positions in communication services (Spotify Technology SA, TKO Group Holdings Inc) and consumer discretionary (Doordash Inc, Skechers USA Inc.) sectors. Additional gains were contributed by a European specialist manager driven by positions in financials (Legal and General Group) and industrials sectors (Spirax Group). Further contribution to gains came from a utilities and renewable manager as well as a technology specialist manager.

#### Macro/Opportunistic Strategy (Return: +2.12%)

The macro strategy contributed to returns, with most gains coming from the quantitative macro portfolio, primarily through European equity index futures. Further gains came from long metals. There was some giveback across a range of positions in the interest rate trading book. A new reinsurance manager, which we added last month, also contributed moderately to gains through catastrophe bond trading.

#### Credit Strategy (Return: +0.94%)

The credit strategy began the year on a positive note, with gains coming from all the managers. The majority of the gains were driven by a long/short and structured credit manager primarily through corporate bond trading positions and, to a less extent, from CDX trades. Additional gains came from the municipal bond trading strategy. A new structured credit manager, which we added last month, also contributed to the gains.

#### **Event Driven Strategy (Return: -0.48%)**

The event driven strategy ended the month slightly negative. The shareholder engagement sub-strategy ended the month moderately positively, with gains coming from a freight transportation provider, Norfolk Southern. However, these gains were offset by losses in the multi-event portfolio, driven by positions in the communication services, utilities and materials sectors.
